



## Sports Funding Statement 2013 - 2014

### Background

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013/14 and 2014/15 to provide new, substantial primary school sports funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school leaders to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all children.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. The sport premium will be paid for the two academic years 2013/14 and 2014/15.

During the academic year 2013-2014, East Hanningfield C of E Primary plans to spend our funding of £5151 on the following areas:

### Employment of experienced and qualified sports coaches

We have identified a considerable lack of extra-curricular opportunities available to children within school. We believe that by increasing the choice and opportunities available the children will become confident learners and improve their health and fitness. We will, as a priority, investigate a range of local sports providers to increase our extra-curricular provision across the school. Taster sessions and places subsidised will be funded by the school.

### IMPACT REPORT

The school has appointed a Sports Organisation, who have run the following extra - curricular clubs during the year:

Gymnastics  
Dance  
Football

The money has been used to provide taster courses within these areas during the Autumn Term and subsidised lessons within the Spring Term. The amount of children attending extra-curricular clubs has increased and this area will be developed further next year.

## **Continuous Professional Development opportunities for staff**

Teachers and Teaching Assistants will be offered a vast array of CPD opportunities to expand their lesson repertoire and develop new ideas for their curriculum lessons. CPD opportunities are crucial in a school that wishes to continue moving forwards and improving. The PE Co-ordinator will attend CPD training to promote PE within school, build links with local schools which will lead to increased competition and engage fully with new initiatives, including the funding area.

## **IMPACT REPORT**

The PE Co-ordinator has attended CPD training which has been provided by the Sports Partnership. An additional Newly Qualified Teacher has attended CPD training to develop skills and confidence in teaching PE. This training has enabled children to receive quality lessons.
